## 2022 in Review...2023 in View

For nearly four decades, the East 91st Street Christian Church Foundation has continued to fulfill Christ's directive: going into the world, teaching, making disciples (Matthew 28:18-20), and meeting the physical needs of hurting people (Matthew 25:35-40). **During 2022, E91 Foundation awarded grants totaling \$117,697!**

Following are those organizations and/or individuals that received grants this past year:

- **Afterbeat/Netherlands** - \$5,000 to minister to young people in the Netherlands.
- **Alexander Christian Foundation** - \$18,000 for college scholarships to Indiana students entering the ministry, and a \$5,000 memorial grant in honor of Scott Read.
- **Allendale Christian Camp and Retreat Center** - \$9,536 to help young people connect with God in His creation through worship, study, and adventure.
- **Bryantsville Hunger Relief Project** - \$3,000 to help purchase market-ready hogs and get them processed into one-pound packages of ground pork for distribution to local Christian food banks in Bedford and Mitchell, Indiana.
- **Central Christian College of the Bible (CCCB)** - \$5,000 for "Lunch and Learn" program being offered through CCCB's Christian Church Leadership Network (CCLN).
- **Central Indiana Young Life** - \$5,000 to help new ministries, particularly under-funded programs, enhance staff in current ministries, and discover ways to provide some of Young Life's specialty ministries.



- **Christian Missionary Fellowship International (CMFI)/ Student Mission Trip** - \$5,100 for a student mission trip to Africa this past March (2022). In 2019, the E91 Foundation received a generous donation from the estate of Otis and Anna Jean Palmer, long-time E91 members specifically earmarked for student mission trips.
- **CMFI/Nairobi, Kenya Sports Ministry** - \$7,500 to support CMFI's Missions of Hope International (MOHI) Sports Ministry and to help fund the construction of two new turf soccer fields in Nairobi, Kenya.
- **CMFI/Shelby Hodge** - \$1,000 to help fund Shelby Hodge's student mission trip to Uruguay, South America, during the summer of 2022. Shelby attends Indiana University, where she serves in Christian Student Fellowship (CSF).
- **Christian Missionary Fellowship International (CMFI)** - \$5,000 to help support CMFI missionary and long-time business owner Mariana Luna for her initial two-year commitment to a new Marketplace Ministry in Mexico City.
- **E91 Church/Camp Allendale** - \$7,025 for summer-camp scholarships. "We just wanted to write and say thank you for providing much-needed scholarships to kids of all ages here at E91" – Tammy Smith, E91 Kids Ministry Director.
- **E91 Church/Counseling Center** - \$500 for suicide-prevention training for church staff and leadership, and \$500 for Storied Lives, a group of four to six participants that meet for 15 weeks.
- **Fountains of Hope** - \$6,000 for installing two-tank, water-purifier systems at Christian schools, churches, and a Young Life Club House located in three regions of Cameroon, Africa, where children and teachers are currently dying from typhoid and/or cholera waterborne diseases.



- **Life Centers** - \$5,000 (plus a \$5,000 matching grant) to send 10 staff members to the annual Heartbeat conference, the largest pregnancy-help conference in the world.
- **Peace Restored, LLC** - \$10,000 to help Mooresville, Indiana-based Peace Restored increase its counseling services, which build on the model developed by East 91st Street Christian Church.
- **Polish Christian Ministries** - \$9,536 to assist Polish Christian congregations to become healthy and growing.
- **Vision Nicaragua** - \$5,000 memorial grant in honor of Scott Read to Vision Nicaragua, a small non-profit in North Carolina that helps families in Nicaragua experience compassion and care through prayer and financial support.
- **Young Life/Raceway Region** - \$5,000 to develop Young Life in five new multi-ethnic communities in the Indianapolis area by 2025 through financial support and culturally intelligent developers working with the community to bring about hope for lost students.
